On this day at the 10:15 service, these children will sit together in the first pew and will receive communion first that day as we honor them. This includes children who have yet to receive Communion as well as those who have already been receiving Communion. All children are receiving instruction about Communion in their Church School class.

## Are You a Homebound Senior Citizen, or know someone who is? Help is Available!

Caregiver Volunteers of Central Jersey (CVCJ) is a non-profit agency committed to enabling the homebound elderly of Ocean County remain living independently in their home. Our faith community of Christ Episcopal Church are Coalition Members of CVCJ and have volunteers available to help you, a senior or an adult child taking care of an elderly family member or friend. There is no charge for the services and there is no income eligibility. The only requirement to receive service is that the loved one needing service is over 60, is no longer driving, and lives in Ocean County or the Monmouth communities of Freehold, Howell or Farmingdale!

What our volunteers can do for you:

- \* provide transportation to medical appointments (maximum of one per week, they use their own car)
  - \* Grocery shopping (they shop for you, once every 2 weeks)
- \* call or visit on a regular basis; we also have certified therapy dogs who will visit you!
- \* relief for caregivers volunteers stay with your loved one for 2-3 hours each week so the family caregiver can get a break! This respite care is for families caring for loved ones with chronic illness, dementia or Alzheimer's disease. CVCJ will be visiting Christ Church the weekend of April 7-8, 2018. #### **Social Justice Corner**

Celebrant Will you strive for justice and peace among all people, and

At least once a year at Easter, we renew our Baptismal Covenant by answering several questions related to our beliefs and how we commit to living into those beliefs. The last question that the celebrant asks is shown above. Each month we will be bringing a thought provoking article related

to this promise.

### "the arc of the moral universe is long, but it bends towards justice"

In her book, "Searching for Sunday", author Rachel Held Evans eloquently affirms that we are "resurrection people". Christians believe in the sure hope of resurrection through the power of God's love for us. She adds, "We believe in a God who knows his way out of a grave."

This belief also applies to our hopes and prayers for a just world. In 1958, Dr. Martin Luther King quoted others when he wrote, "'the arc of the moral universe is long, but it bends toward justice." In a small way, we, at Christ Church, have witnessed our own slow movement towards justice. Let us celebrate this movement in this season of Easter.

More than 50 years ago, an assisting priest at Christ Church wanted to honor the memory of his mother and commissioned a painting showing Jesus in the presence of four children – one black, one Asian, one native American, and one white. We believe that he wanted a painting that represented his mother's love for children of all races. This painting hung on the wall behind our Baptismal font for half a century.

Somewhere along the way, a few parishioners noticed the painting and pointed out that the depiction of the children used images that may be problematic The Asian and Native American children were more like caricatures in costume. The black child was dressed in clothing that we might associate with a poor sharecropper. Meanwhile, the

white girl was the largest of the four and was dressed in a pretty white dress and 'party shoes'. The disparity in the children was clear.

Several years ago, this disparity was pointed out to the Christ Church parish leadership. Unfortunately, they refused to take down the painting. The parish was working through other issues. It wasn't the right time. They didn't want to stir up more trouble.

When the painting was noticed again a few years ago, it raised some concern. We asked ourselves, "If a person of color visited our parish and notice the painting, how might they feel?" We sent a picture of the painting to several people of color from around the diocese to ask their view. Their reaction was clear. The painting needed to come down. Some people in the parish were upset. Metaphorically, some may have felt like Jesus was returning to the grave.

However, we are a resurrection people. Christ Church is blessed to have Suzanne Schleck among its members. Suzanne is an experienced iconographer and teaches this craft to others. Suzanne is also a generous woman who decided to create a new icon that still expressed Jesus' love for all children without the problematic images. This was a long process but, last year, Suzanne finished this new icon and presented it as a gift to Christ Church. It now hangs behind the Baptismal font in the same location as the previous painting.

On April 1, we celebrate Easter and Christ's resurrection from the tomb. In a small way we saw a resurrection happen in our own church. Thank you, Suzanne. Happy Easter, Christ is Risen! Alleluia, Alleluia, Alleluia!
