My Dearly Beloved of the Diocese of New Jersey:

Do not be afraid; for see --I am bringing you news of great joy for all people: for to you is born this day in the city of David a Savior who is the Messiah, the Lord...

Luke 2:10-11

The wondrous announcement of the angel Gabriel to the Shepherds captivates me. The angel speaks clearly to the shepherds: "Fear not!" How often our lives and our worlds are marked by fear. Anxiety and angst are deep. It is often paralyzing. We must heed the angelic messenger and fear not! More than that, we need to embrace the news which the angel announces: "To you is born this day in the City of David a Savior, which is Christ the Lord." It is Good news, saving news, for those shepherds and for us.

The great German Reformer Martin Luther once wrote:

"The Gospel does not merely teach about the history of Christ. No, it enables all who believe it to receive it as their own, which is the way the Gospel operates. Of what benefit would it be to me if Christ had been born a thousand times, and it would daily be sung into my ears in a most lovely manner, if I were never to hear that he was born for me and was to be my very own? If the voice gives forth this pleasant sound, even if it be in homely phrase, my heart listens with joy, for it is a lovely sound which penetrates my soul."
